THE TWINS: The Twins began their six-game homestand with a three-game sweep over the White Sox this week, followed by a loss to the Royals last night...tonight the Twins will play the second of three vs. Kansas City through tomorrow...following tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to St. Petersburg to begin a seven-game roadtrip with three at Tampa Bay and four at Kansas City...the Twins are 34-36 at home and 36-28 on the road...they are 18-8 in their last 26.

TWINS COMEBACK FALLS SHORT: The Twins lost to the Royals last night by a score of 7-6... Dillon Gee (1-2) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on six hits in 2.2 innings pitched... the offense recorded nine hits, including multiple hits from Brian Dozier, Joe Mauer, Jorge Polanco and Max Kepler...Polanco drove in three runs and hit his 10th homer of the season and seventh in his last 12 games.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the 14th of 19 games this season... they are 8-5 against the Royals this season, going 5-2 at Target Field and 3-3 at Kauffman Stadium...a win tonight would mark their most vs. KC in a season since going 11-7 in 2012.

☞ Brian Dozier has hit safely in eight straight against the Royals, hitting .324 (12-for-37) with four doubles and five RBI in those games.

☞ Max Kepler has reached safely in 12 of 13 games against the Royals this season...he is hitting .356 (16-for-45) with six doubles, 10 walks and a .482 OBP.

☞ Joe Mauer is hitting .313 (223-for-712) with 41 doubles, four triples, 14 home runs, 117 RBI and a .399 on-base percentage in 192 career games against the Royals...he leads all actives in batting average and on-base percentage vs. KC (minimum 500 at-bats).

DRIVING IN HISTORY: Joe Mauer drove in two runs last night, giving him 858 for his career, moving within two of tying Justin Morneau for fifth on the Twins all-time list (since 1961):

MAUER BEING MAUER: Joe Mauer has hit safely in 10 straight games, tying his season-high, previously done May 9-22...his last streak of 11-plus came July 17-30, 2015 (11)...in fact, in 21 games since August 10, he is hitting .412 (35-for-85) which ranks second best in baseball, trailing only Avisail Garcia (433).

☞ He is hitting .455 (15-for-33) with a .514 on-base percentage in his last eight home games.

HOLY JORGE! Jorge Polanco has hit safely in 25 of his last 28 games, hitting .381 (40-for-105) with 10 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 26 RBI and 17 runs scored...his average since that date leads baseball and his 1.135 OPS ranks fifth.

WELCOME TO MY HOUSE: The Twins had their seven-game home win-streak snapped last night, losing here for the first time since August 17 vs. Cleveland (Game 2)...they are 10-3 in their last 13 at Target Field and 20-12 here since June 20 after starting the season going 14-24 at home...their 20 home wins since June 20 rank fourth best in baseball, trailing Los Angeles-NL (26), Washington (22) and Cleveland (21).

☞ Max Kepler has hit safely in 10 straight home games, hitting .368 (14-for-38) with five doubles, four home runs and 11 RBI in that span.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2004, Terry Mulholland pitched 6.0 innings and allowed two runs in the Twins 4-2 win over Baltimore... Mulholland and catcher Pat Borders, who was obtained the previous day from Seattle for B.J. Garbe, became the first pair of 40-plus batterymates since Curt Davis and Clyde Sukeforth for the Dodgers in 1945.

ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD: Major League Baseball and Chevrolet announced yesterday the names of the 30 2017 club nominees for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award presented by Chevrolet...Joe Mauer is the Twins nominee for the second consecutive season... The Roberto Clemente Award is the annual recognition of a player from each MLB Club who best represents the game of Baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field...Wednesday, September 6th marks the 16th annual Roberto Clemente Day, which was established by Major League Baseball to honor Clemente's legacy and to officially acknowledge local Club nominees of the Roberto Clemente Award...last season's winner was Curtis Granderson... previous Twins to win this award were Rod Carew (1977), Dave Winfield (1994) and Kirby Puckett (1996).
