THE TWINS: The Twins completed their 11-game roadtrip with a record of 5-6, going 3-0 at Progressive Field, 1-3 at Fenway Park and 1-3 at Kauffman Stadium...tonight they will begin a seven-game homestand, leading up to the All-Star break...they host the Angels for three tonight through Wednesday and the Orioles for four from Thursday through Sunday...the Twins are 16-25 at home and 25-15 on the road.

TWINS LOSE FINALE AT KAUFFMAN: The Twins lost to the Royals yesterday afternoon by a score of 6-2...Hector Santiago (4-8) was the starter and loser, allowing four runs on four hits in 3.1 innings pitched...Trevor Hildenberger pitched 2.0 scoreless innings of relief, extending his scoreless inning streak to 5.0 to start his career...the offense recorded eight hits and went 2-for-11 with runners in scoring position...Miguel Sanó and Eduardo Escobar each had two hits-a-piece.

TWINS AND ANGELS: The Twins are playing the fifth of seven games against the Angels this season...they are 3-1 against Anaheim this season, having won a four-game series at Angel Stadium June 1-4...the Twins have won eight of their last 11 against the Angels overall...they last hosted the Angels from April 15-17, 2016, sweeping in three games...they have won four straight over the Angels at Target Field, dating back to 2015...the last time they won five straight at home over the Angels came June 3-September 7, 1996 at the Dome.

MAUER OWNS ANGELS: Joe Mauer is hitting .340 (104-for-306) with 16 doubles, 10 home runs, 53 RBI, 42 runs scored, 38 walks and a .412 on-base percentage in 82 career games against the Angels...his .340 average is the second highest all-time against the Angels (minimum 200 at-bats), trailing Jose Altuve (.358)...his .412 OBP is 12th highest all-time against the Angels...additionally, Mauer's .340 average is his third highest against any AL opponent (Tampa Bay - .364, Baltimore - .341).

TWINS GOING TO MIAMI: Miguel Sanó (1st selection) and Ervin Santana (2nd selection) have been named to the 2017 American League All-Star team...Sanó becomes the fifth Twins third baseman (since 1961) to ever be an All-Star (Rich Rollins - 1962; Harmon Killebrew - 1966, '69 & '70; Gary Gaetti - 1988 & '89; and Ron Coomer - 1999)...Santana becomes the first Twins starting pitcher since Johan Santana in 2007 (complete list of Twins All-Stars on page 404 of Media Guide)...Santana's previous All-Star appearance came in 2008 for the Angels...the last gap as long as Santana's between selections for a position player was Adam Dunn in 2002 then 2012, and for a pitcher was Andy Pettitte in 2001 then 2010.

WHY THEY'RE ALL-STARS:

- ☞ Sanó leads all AL third basemen in RBI (58), tied for first in walks (43), second in on-base percentage (.371), slugging percentage (.548) and OPS (.919), and third in home runs (20)...he is hitting .341 (45-for-132) with 15 home runs, 44 RBI and a .453 on-base percentage in wins and .207 (29-for-140) with five home runs, 14 RBI and a .288 on-base percentage in losses.
- ☞ Santana currently ranks first in all of baseball in shutouts (3), fifth in opponent average (.204), tied for fourth in wins (10) and ninth in WHIP (1.09)...additionally, he is 16-9, 2.73 ERA (227.1 IP, 69 ER) with opponents hitting .209 in his last 35 starts, dating back to June 19, 2016...since that date, he ranks third in all of baseball in opponent average, fourth in ERA (2.73), and fifth in WHIP (1.07) among qualified pitchers in that span.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2010, Jim Thome hit career home runs 573 and 574 at Target Field vs. Tampa Bay, both off Wade Davis...his 574th moved him past Harmon Killebrew, into sole possession of 10th on baseball's all-time home run list...it marked Thome's 45th career multi-homer game.

WELCOME BACK, RODNEY: Rod and Rhonda Carew are making his first trip back to Minnesota since Rod had his heart transplant on December 16, 2016...themes for tonight include Heart of 29 Campaign / American Heart Association, 40th Anniversary of Rod's 1977 MVP Season, and 50th Anniversary of Rod's 1967 AL Rookie of the Year Season...game day plans include: First 10,000 fans receive a poster commemorating the famed Rod Carew/TIME magazine cover from 1977, various pregame elements, team wearing Heart of 29 patch, and 1977 MVP Trophy displayed in the park.

THIS AND THAT:

- ☞ Twins have a .390 winning percentage (16-25) at home, the lowest in baseball.
- ☞ Reliever Taylor Rogers has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak, dating back to June 4, the fifth longest active streak in the AL.
- ☞ The Twins have committed 38 errors this season, tied with Colorado for second fewest in baseball, trailing Kansas City (33).
- ☞ Eduardo Escobar has hit safely in nine straight at home, hitting .472 (17-for-36) and a .513 on-base percentage in that span.
