THE TWINS: After completing their six-game homestand with a record of 4-2 (3-0 vs. Chicago-AL and 1-2 vs. Kansas City), the Twins began their seven-game roadtrip with a loss to Tampa Bay last night...tonight they will play the second of three vs. the Rays...following tomorrow's finale, they will travel to Kansas City for four from Thursday-Sunday...the Twins are 35-37 at home and 36-29 on the road...they are 19-10 in their last 29.

FLOP AT THE TROP: The Twins lost to the Rays last night by a score of 11-4, their most runs allowed since allowing 12 on August 12 at Detroit...José Berrios (12-7) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings with seven strikeouts...the offense recorded five hits and struck out 11 times...Brian Dozier reached 28 homers for the third straight season.

MAUER MILESTONES: Mauer recorded his 30th double last night, giving him sole possession of second on the Twins all-time list in 30-double seasons with eight, passing Tony Oliva (7); he now trails Kirby Puckett who had nine...he is five doubles away from 400...additionally, needs one RBI to pass Justin Morneau and move into fifth on the Twins all-time RBI list and six runs scored to tie Rod Carew for third:

BIG WHEELS: Byron Buxton is 25-for-26 in stolen base attempts this season and is successful in each of his last 20 chances...his 96.2 stolen base percentage leads baseball and is the highest in Twins history (since 1961)...below are the longest successful stolen base streaks in Twins history:

ROSTER MOVES: The Twins announced today that they have returned outfielder Robbie Grossman from rehab assignment and reinstated from the 10-day disabled list...they have also selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Michael Tonkin, recalled right-handed pitcher J.T. Chargois from Triple-A Rochester and placed him on the 60-day disabled list, and reinstated left-handed pitcher Dietrich Enns from the 10-day disabled list and optioned him to Double-A Chattanooga...Grossman, who missed the last 18 games with a fractured left thumb, played in two games on rehab assignment for Triple-A Rochester, going 1-for-7 with two walks...Enns, who missed the last 20 games with a left shoulder strain, appeared in two games on rehab assignment with Triple-A Rochester, allowing one run on six hits in 5.2 innings pitched with two walks and five strikeouts...he will join the Lookouts, who begin their playoff schedule tomorrow night vs. Montgomery...additionally, left-handed pitcher Adalberto Mejia will have his rehab assignment transferred from Rochester to Chattanooga...he has missed the last 25 games with a left arm brachialis strain...Mejia appeared in two games on rehab assignment with Rochester, allowing one run on eight hits in 8.0 innings pitched.

FLORIDA JUST GOT SEXIER: Bartolo Colón is making his 25th career start vs. the Rays, marking the seventh different uniform he's worn when facing the Rays (previously Cleveland, Chicago-AL, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Oakland, New York-NL), most of any starting pitcher and tied for the most of any player overall (full list on page 2 of Twins notes)...Colón is the only remaining active player who debuted before the Rays played their first game.

TWINS AND RAYS: The Twins are 1-3 against the Rays this season...they are 6-3 in their last nine at Tropicana Field.
 ⚡ Eddie Rosario has hit safely in 11 of 13 career games against the Rays, hitting .472 (16-for-43) with four doubles, three home runs and five RBI.
 ⚡ Byron Buxton is hitting .357 (15-for-42) in 12 of 13 career games against Tampa Bay.
 ⚡ Joe Mauer has reached safely via hit or walk in 24 straight against the Rays...he is a career .362 (89-for-246) hitter against Tampa Bay with 17 doubles, two triples, four home runs, 45 walks, 36 runs scored and just 39 strikeouts in 66 games...his .362 average and .459 on-base percentage both rank as the highest against the Rays all-time.
 ⚡ Mauer has hit .388 (50-for-129) in 33 career games at Tropicana Field with a .490 on-base percentage, both the highest ever in this ballpark...he has reached base safely in 32 of 33 career games at Tropicana Field.

MAUER BEING MAUER: Joe Mauer has hit safely in a season-high 13 straight games, hitting .423 (22-for-52) with eight doubles in that span, the longest streak in the AL and second longest in baseball (Philadelphia's Odubel Herrera extended his current hit-streak to 18 straight with a pinch-hit last night)...Mauer's last streak of more than 13 came June 19-August 15, 2014 when he hit in a career-long 16 straight...he has five career streaks longer than his current streak (16, 16, 15, 15 and 14)...in fact, in 24 games since August 10, he is hitting .423 (41-for-97) which leads baseball.

MINOR MATTERS: Twins minor league affiliate notes from yesterday:
 ⚡ Triple-A Rochester lost to Pawtucket yesterday afternoon by a score of 10-1...Lehigh Valley beat Scranton-Wilkes-Barre by a score of 4-3, claiming the final wild card spot via the tie breaker based on regular season series (vs. Rochester)...Red Wings at 80-62 have now won 80 games in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1974-75.
 ⚡ Double-A Chattanooga beat Montgomery (Tampa Bay) yesterday by a score of 2-1, earning their 91st win setting a club record...the only other Lookouts team with 90 wins in a season was in 1992.
 ⚡ Low-A Cedar Rapids lost 3-0 to Beloit in the regular season finale...the Kernels will host Kane County on Wednesday night in Game One of the Midwest League Quarterfinals...the Kernels finished with a record of 75-65.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his ninth start with the Twins on August 31 vs. Chicago-AL...allowed three runs on 10 hits without a season-high eight strikeouts, but did not factor into the decision...first two runs came in the top of the second inning on an RBI-single from Rob Brantly and an RBI-double from Adam Engel...pitched 5.0-plus innings for the eighth consecutive start.

AGAINST THE RAYS: Colón is 9-6, 4.07 ERA (146.0 IP, 66 ER) in 24 career starts vs. Tampa Bay...suffered the loss in his last start vs. the Rays on August 9, 2015, allowing four runs on nine hits in 6.2 innings (with the Mets)...last earned the win vs. the Rays on April 26, 2007, allowing two runs on four hits in 7.0 innings (with the Angels)...is 3-3, 3.62 ERA (77.0 IP, 31 ER) vs. Tampa Bay at Tropicana Field.

- Colón is making his 25th career start vs. the Rays...is the seventh different uniform he's worn when facing the Rays (prev. Indians, White Sox, Angels, Yankees, A's, Mets, Twins), most of any starting pitcher and tied for the most of any player overall—also RHP Latroy Hawkins, RHP Octavio Dotel, INF Danny Valencia, INF Wilson Betemit and C Sal Fasano.
- Colón is the only remaining active player who debuted before the Rays played their first game.
- Colón was a teammate of Manager, Kevin Cash, who caught for him one game with Boston (September 13, 2008 vs. Toronto, Game 2 of a doubleheader).

AND THAT'S A WRAP: Colón's defeated the Diamondbacks in his last start on August 20, his 30th team in which he has defeated...was just the 18th pitcher to have beat all 30 teams and third among active pitchers, joining John Lackey (Chicago-NL) and Max Scherzer (Washington).

ELIAS SAYS: Colón's first complete game of the season on August 4, was an MLB-leading sixth complete game for a Twins starter this season (Santana has the other 5)...Colón, 44, became the oldest pitcher to throw a complete game and earn the win since Jaime Moyer, 47, for the Phillies on June 5, 2010 vs. San Diego...the oldest in the AL since Nolan Ryan, 45, for the Rangers on July 4, 1992 vs. New York-AL...the oldest in Twins franchise history besting Connie Marrero, 43, for the Senators in 1954. Colón has thrown a complete game for eight different major league teams: Indians, Expos, Angels, White Sox, Yankees, A's, Mets and Twin.

A WIN AT TARGET FIELD: Friday, August 4, 2017 marked Colón's first win at Target Field, which is the 40th venue at which Colón has recorded a win...only three other pitchers in the modern era have recorded a win at 40 or more stadiums, Randy Johnson (43), Jamie Moyer (42) and Pedro Martinez (40)...the all-time record holder is Tim Lincecum, who won 342 games at 47 different stadiums from 1880-1893.

- Has now won with his 10th organization...is one behind LaTroy Hawkins, Mike Morgan and Ron Villone who lead all of baseball with a win in 11 different organizations...others with 10 include Octavio Dotel, Alan Embree, Edwin Jackson, Julian Tavarez, Rick White and Jamey Wright.

DON'T TELL FATHER TIME: Colón is the oldest active player in the major leagues...he's the second-oldest pitcher in Twins history and the oldest since Jesse Orosco in 2003 (46)...he is the oldest Twin to ever start a game, and the oldest since Joe Niekro (43 in 1988)...he's the sixth 40-plus-year-old pitcher in Twins history, joining Orosco (46 in 2003), Niekro (42-43 from 1987-88), Steve Carlton (43 in 1988), Terry Mulholland (41-42 from 2004-05) and Al Worthington (40 in 1969).

CHASING HISTORY: Colón is four wins shy of matching Juan Marichal (243) for the most wins by a Dominican-born pitcher in major league history...Twins teammate Ervin Santana ranks fourth on the list with 146 career wins.

NOT AS SHARP: Colón is averaging 2.29 walks-per-9.0-innings this season, his highest mark since 2009 (3.03)...has posted a walks-per-9.0-innings average below 2.00 in four straight seasons since 2012.

WELCOME HOME: Colón's debut at Target Field on July 18 marked the 45th ballpark he has pitched in during his career...prior to his start, Target Field was the only active ballpark in which he had not pitched...Colón started 11 games at the Metrodome from 1997-2005, going 3-6 with a 4.46 ERA (66.2 IP, 33 ER)...in his first career game at the Dome on July 13, 1997, LaTroy Hawkins started for Minnesota and Paul Molitor batted third.

CAREER NOTES

- Has pitched for nine organizations in his career prior to signing with Minnesota: Cleveland, Montreal, Chicago-AL, Los Angeles-AL, Boston, New York-AL, Oakland, New York-NL and Atlanta.
- Is a four-time All-Star (1998, 2005, 2013 and 2016) and won the AL Cy Young Award in 2005.
- At 44 years old, he is the oldest active player in Major League Baseball.
- Ranked first among active pitchers entering the 2017 season in wins (218) and innings (3,172.1) and second in strikeouts (2,365), shutouts (13) and complete games (36).
- From 1998-2005, he was the only MLB pitcher to win at least 14 games in each season.
- Is 3-5 with a 3.49 ERA (/67.0 IP, 26 ER) in 17 career postseason games.
- Entered the season with 233 wins, the third-most by a Latin American born pitcher...trails Dennis Martinez (Nicaragua) who has 245 career wins and Marichal.
- Is the only remaining active player to have played for the Montreal Expos.
