**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 4-1 through five games on their six-game homestand, sweeping the White Sox in three and splitting the first two with the Royals...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale before traveling to St. Petersburg to begin a seven-game roadtrip with three at Tampa Bay Monday-Wednesday and four at Kansas City Thursday-Sunday...the Twins are 35-36 at home and 36-28 on the road...they are 19-8 in their last 27.

**SATURDAY'S FOR THE BLOWOUTS:** The Twins beat the Royals last night by a score of 17-0, their largest margin of victory in a shutout in Twins (since 1961) or Senators (since 1901) history...Kyle Gibson (9-10) was the starter and winner, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with five hits and no walks...the offense recorded 14 hits, four from Joe Mauer...Eduardo Escobar went 3-for-5 with two home runs, tying a career-high with six RBI.

**FROM ELIAS:** More notes from last night:

⊕ The first five batters in the Twins lineup—Brian Dozier, Joe Mauer, Byron Buxton, Jorge Polanco, and Eduardo Escobar—each finished with multiple runs scored and multiple runs batted in...marked the second time this season that five-or-more players did that in a game for the Twins; six players produced at least two runs and two RBI for Minnesota on June 13 vs. the Mariners...no other team in the majors has had even one game of that kind since the start of last season.

⊕ Escobar's 11 total bases were more than the Royals compiled as a team (7)...Escobar became the third Twins player to total more than 10 bases in a game this season, joining Eddie Rosario (13 total bases on June 13) and Byron Buxton (13 on August 27)...two other teams this season have had at least three games in which a player finished with more than 10 bases...five Nationals players have had such a game this season (Bryce Harper, Anthony Rendon, Jayson Werth, Michael Taylor, Ryan Zimmerman), while the Braves have had three such games (two by Freddie Freeman, one by Matt Kemp).

**TWINS AND ROYALS:** The Twins and Royals are playing the 15th of 19 games this season...they are 9-5 against the Royals this season, going 6-2 at Target Field and 3-3 at Kauffman Stadium...last night's win marked their most vs. KC in a season since going 11-7 in 2012...a win today would make the Twins 4-1-0 in series play vs. the Royals this season.

⊕ Brian Dozier has hit safely in nine straight against the Royals, hitting .333 (13-for-39) with four doubles, one home run and eight RBI in those games.

⊕ Max Kepler has reached safely in 12 of 13 games against the Royals this season...he is hitting .356 (16-for-45) with six doubles, 10 walks and a .482 OBP.

⊕ Joe Mauer is hitting .317 (227-for-716) with 42 doubles, four triples, 14 home runs, 119 RBI and a .402 on-base percentage in 193 career games against the Royals...he leads all actives in batting average and on-base percentage vs. KC (minimum 500 at-bats).

**MAUER MILESTONES:** Joe Mauer needs one RBI to pass Justin Morneau and move into fifth on the Twins all-time list (since 1961) and seven runs scored to tie Rod Carew for third:

**PLUS-MINUS:** The Twins enter today with a run differential of +1 (669-668)...through games of August 3 they had a run differential of -75...the last time they were in the plus was May 28 at +1 (210-209).

**MAUER BEING MAUER:** Joe Mauer has hit safely in 11 straight games, tying his season-high, previously done May 9-22...his last streak of 11-plus came July 17-30, 2015 (11); last streak of 12-plus came September 17, 2014-April 10, 2015 (12)...in fact, in 22 games since August 10, he is hitting .438 (39-for-89) which ranks second best in baseball, trailing only Avisail Garcia (.451).

**WELCOME TO MY HOUSE:** The Twins are 11-3 in their last 14 at Target Field and 21-12 here since June 20 after starting the season going 14-24 at home...their 21 home wins since June 20 are tied with Cleveland for third best in baseball, trailing Los Angeles-NL (26) and Washington (22).

**TWINS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Rookie-Level Elizabethton outfielder Akil Baddoo has been named Twins minor league Player of the Week...Baddoo played six games for the E-Twins, hitting .348 with two doubles, one home run, four RBI, six walks, five runs scored and a .483 on-base percentage...the 19-year-old has appeared in 33 games, hitting .357 (45-for-126) with 15 doubles, two triples, three home runs and 19 RBI...he was drafted by the Twins in the second round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Salem (GA) High School.

**GCL ALL-STAR:** The Gulf Coast League announced recently their 2017 All-Star Team...the Twins are represented by outfielder Jean Carlos Arias...Arias played 48 games for the GCL Twins this season, hitting .298 (50-for-168) with seven doubles, four triples, five home runs, 32 RBI, 30 runs scored and 10 stolen bases...the Santiago, Dominican Republic native was signed by the Twins as an amateur free agent July 2, 2014.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Santana allowed three runs on seven hits in 6.2 innings with seven strikeouts, earning his 14th win of the season in his last start on August 29 vs. Chicago-AL...has pitched 5.0-plus innings for seven straight outings...five quality starts in August.

**AGAINST THE ROYALS:** Santana is 6-10, 4.59 ERA (145.0 IP, 74 ER) in 23 career starts vs. Kansas City...allowed seven runs (5 earned) on eight hits in 5.1 innings, suffering the loss in his last start vs. the Royals on June 30...last earned the win vs. Kansas City on April 3 (Season Opener), allowing one run on two hits in 7.0 innings...is 1-2, 4.56 ERA (23.2 IP, 12 ER) with 16 strikeouts in four career starts vs. the Royals at Target Field.

**ON THE LEADERBOARD:** Santana currently ranks first in all of baseball in shutouts (3) and complete games (5), tied for fifth in wins (14), eighth in opponents average (.219) and in hits per nine innings (7.31).

**ON A ROLL:** Santana is 20-11, 2.93 ERA (292.0 IP, 95 ER) with opponents hitting .216 in his last 45 starts dating back to June 19, 2016...since that date, he ranks fifth in all of baseball in ERA (2.93), sixth in opponent average (.215), and seventh in WHIP (1.11) among qualified pitchers in that span.

**TWINS ARE COMPLETE:** Santana has recorded five complete games this season...the highest mark in all of baseball...Santana marks the first pitcher on the Twins organization to have five complete games since Carl Pavano who had seven in 2010.

**FINISHING WHAT HE STARTED:** Santana leads the major leagues with three shutouts this season...shutout San Francisco on June 9 at AT&T Park, Baltimore on May 23 at Camden Yards and Chicago-AL on April 15, allowing just one hit...is one of two pitchers in baseball with multiple shutouts this season (Corey Kluber has 2)...Santana's four shutouts since the beginning of the 2016 season are tied with Kluber for the most in baseball...is the first Twin to throw three or more shutouts in a season since Rich Robertson in 1996 (3)...is the first pitcher to throw three or more shutouts with four-or-fewer hits allowed in each since Max Scherzer (3x) in 2015, and is one of just five pitchers to do so since 2000...is the first Twin to do so since Scott Erickson in 1992 (3x)...has thrown 20 complete games in his career (6 with Minnesota).

**HE'S BEEN A HIT:** Santana has allowed 143 hits this season...has thrown 6.0-plus innings and allowed four-or-fewer hits in 11 games this season, second most starts in the American League behind Chris Sale (15)...had just seven such starts last season and has surpassed his career-high for such games in a season (9 in 2012)...Santana pitched 6.0-plus innings and allowed four or fewer hits in each of his first six starts this season, matching Nolan Ryan (1971) for the longest streak to begin a season in history...was the second-longest overall streak in Twins history (10 straight by Johan Santana in 2004).

**MODEL OF CONSISTENCY:** Santana has pitched 6.0-plus innings and allowed one or fewer runs in 11 of his 26 starts this season, one behind Clayton Kershaw (11) for the most such starts in baseball...Santana had five such starts all of last season...10 such starts matches a career-high (2008 and 2013).

**WINNING WAYS:** His 14 wins this season already surpass his respective season totals from the 2016 and 2015 seasons (7 wins)...14 wins are his most since tying his 14 earned wins in 2014 with Atlanta...Santana has won 10-plus games seven times in his career...began the season 5-0 (in decisions) for the second time in his career (started 6-0 with Los Angeles-AL in 2008)...is the first Twin to start a season 5-0 since Carlos Silva started 5-0 in 2004 (Brian Duensing started 5-0 in 2009 after joining the rotation in August).

**KEEPING THE DEFENSE BUSY:** Santana is averaging just 7.47 strikeouts per nine innings so far this season, his lowest mark since 2014 (8.22)...opponents are hitting just .241 on batted balls in play so far this season vs. Santana, the fourth lowest mark in baseball, behind Max Scherzer (.240), Lance Lynn (.240) and Ariel Miranda (.232).

**HEY NOW, HE'S AN ALL STAR:** Santana pitched the sixth inning for the American League in the All-Star Game on July 11...allowed a solo home run to Yadier Molina, tying the game...also recorded a strikeout (Josh Harrison)...was his second career All-Star Game selection and appearance (2008).

- Signed a four-year contract with the Twins December 13, 2014.
- Signed as a free agent with the Atlanta Braves March 12, 2014, spending his only season in the National League...his 14 wins tied for the team lead with Julio Teheran.
- Recorded his 100th career win, June 8, 2013 vs. Houston, in his only season in Kansas City.
- Traded to Kansas City October 31, 2012...left the Angels organization in the club's all-time top 10 in wins (7th, 96), innings (6th, 1,475.2) and strikeouts (6th, 1,167).
- Pitched no-hitter July 27, 2011 at Cleveland, allowing an unearned run and a walk with 10 strikeouts, marking the eighth individual no-hitter in Angels history.
- Selected to his only career All-Star Game in 2008...finished year second in AL in strikeouts (214), fourth in innings pitched (219.0) and tied seventh in wins (16).
- Started Game 5 of 2005 ALDS at Yankee Stadium in his rookie season...recorded the win after allowing three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings...became sixth rookie to win decisive postseason series game.
- Signed by the Anaheim Angels as an undrafted free agent September 2, 2000.
