**NORTHMEN:** The Twins have gone 2-1 thus far on their seven-game homestand, beating the Angels twice then losing the series finale...tonight they will play the final series leading up to the All-Star break, with the first of four against Baltimore...they will wrap up the "first half" on Sunday afternoon...the Twins are 18-26 at home and 25-15 on the road.

**ANGELS, THE KING SLAYER:** The Twins lost to the Angels last night in the three-game series finale by a score of 2-1...Ervin Santana (10-6) was the starter and loser, allowing two runs on seven hits while pitching his MLB-best fourth complete game...the offense recorded seven hits, went 1-for-7 with runners in scoring position and left nine men on base...Byron Buxton went 2-for-4, giving him five hits in his last seven at-bats.

**THREE-EYED ORIOLE:** The Twins have gone 3-0 against the Orioles this season, sweeping a three-game series at Oriole Park from May 22-24, out-scoring them 20-10 and out-hitting them 37-19...the Twins have won four straight over Baltimore, dating back to July of 2016; they are 12-5 in their last 17 against the O's, dating back to September of 2014.

⊕ During the three-game series, Twins batters hit .319 (37-for-116) with 12 doubles and three home runs (Sanó, Kepler, Dozier).

⊕ Robbie Grossman is hitting .382 (13-for-34) with five doubles, one home run, four RBI, five walks and a .462 on-base percentage in 10 career games against Baltimore.

⊕ Joe Mauer is a career .341 (92-for-270) hitter against the Orioles, with 18 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 42 RBI, 45 runs scored and a .403 on-base percentage in 71 games.

**KINGS OF THE NORTH:** Miguel Sanó (1st selection) and Ervin Santana (2nd selection) have been named to the 2017 American League All-Star team.

⊕ Miguel Sanó leads all AL third basemen in RBI (60), second in walks (43), on-base percentage (.372) and OPS (.916), and third in slugging percentage (.544) and home runs (20)...he is hitting .348 (49-for-141) with 15 home runs, 46 RBI and a .452 on-base percentage in wins and .208 (30-for-144) with five home runs, 14 RBI and a .288 on-base percentage in losses.

⊕ Ervin Santana currently ranks first in all of baseball in complete games (4) and shutouts (3), sixth in opponent average (.206), tied for fourth in wins (10) and ninth in WHIP (1.08)...his .206 opponent batting average is the second lowest for a Twin pre-All-Star break since 2000 (Liriano - .201 in 2006) and ninth lowest in club history.

**BATTLE OF THE WALL:** Miguel Sanó will participate in the 2017 T-Mobile Home Run Derby on Monday, July 10 at Marlins Park...brackets were announced yesterday as he will face Mike Moustakas in the first round; if he advances he will face the winner of Giancarlo Stanton and Gary Sánchez...he will be the seventh Twin to participate in the Derby, joining Tom Brunansky (1985), Gary Gaetti (1989), Torii Hunter (2002), Justin Morneau (2007 and 2008), Joe Mauer (2009) and Brian Dozier (2014)...Morneau is the only Twin to ever win the Derby, having done so in 2008 at Yankee Stadium, beating Josh Hamilton...Sanó ranks eighth in the AL with 20 homers...additionally, he ranks second in baseball in exit velocity (95.1), trailing only Aaron Judge (97.3).

**KING'S LANDING:** The Twins have won four of their last six at Target Field...in their last 13 home games, they are hitting .286 (127-for-44) with 19 home runs, a .352 on-base percentage and 5.1 runs-per-game...in that same span, they are hitting .345 (38-for-110) with runners in scoring position at home.

**WINTER'S NOT COMING:** Through six games in July, the Twins are hitting .302 (65-for-215) with 15 doubles, 26 walks, 33 runs scored and a .382 on-base percentage...their 65 hits are tied with Boston for the most in baseball; 15 doubles are tied for third and the .382 on-base percentage is tied for fourth.

⊕ Thus far in July: Max Kepler is 9-for-19 (.474) with four doubles, four walks and a .583 on-base percentage...Eddie Rosario is 9-for-21 (.429) with two doubles and a .455 on-base percentage...Byron Buxton is 7-for-18 (.389) with a .450 on-base percentage...Miguel Sanó is 9-for-26 (.346) with two home runs and six RBI.

**EDDARD(O) STARK:** Eduardo Escobar is hitting .426 (20-for-47) with five doubles, two home runs, six RBI, nine runs scored and a .481 on-base percentage in his last 12 games at Target Field...additionally, he enters tonight with 98 career doubles.

**THE WHITE WALKERS:** Robbie Grossman has drawn 44 walks this season, tied for seventh most in the AL...Miguel Sanó has drawn 43 walks, ranking 10th in the AL...the Twins enter today second in the AL in walks (314), trailing New York (334), and fourth in baseball, trailing Los Angeles-NL (354), the Yankees and Chicago-NL (325).

**THE NIGHT'S WATCH:** Eddie Rosario is hitting .321 (43-for-134) with seven doubles, five home runs, 14 RBI, 19 runs scored and a .350 on-base percentage in 41 night games this season...Miguel Sanó is hitting .297 (46-for-155) with 13 home runs, 34 RBI, 21 walks and a .381 on-base percentage in 41 night games this season.

**HOLD THE DOOR:** Taylor Rogers has 19 holds, the most in the AL and tied with Colorado's Adam Ottavino for most in baseball...Ryan Pressly led the club in holds in 2016 with 14...Rogers is on pace for 36 holds which would set a club record and pass Matt Guerrier (2009) and J.C. Romero (2002) who share the record at 33.

**THE SEVEN:** Joe Mauer is considered day-to-day, suffering from low back spasms he began to experience during Tuesday's game with the Angels.

**THE OLD GODS (ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY):** In 2014, Glen Perkins and Kurt Suzuki were named to the American League All-Star team as they combined to pitch/catch the ninth inning and secure the 5-3 AL victory...in 2007, Ron Gardenhire earned his 500th career managerial victory with a 20-14 win at Chicago-AL; Torii Hunter had three hits in that game and Joe Mauer had four.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Berríos allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high nine hits but did not factor into the decision in his last start on July 1 at Kansas City...the nine hits allowed matched a career-high (also: September 5, 2016 vs. Kansas City)...surrendered solo home runs to Mike Moustakas (4th inning) and Brandon Moss (5th inning) and a two-run homer to Alcides Escobar (4th inning)...allowed three-plus homers for the second time this season (also: May 24 at Baltimore)...has allowed just two homers in his other eight starts combined...has a 7.15 ERA (11.1 IP, 9 ER) in his last two starts after posting a 2.67 ERA (54.0 IP, 16 ER) in his first eight starts.

**AGAINST THE ORIOLLES:** Berríos is 1-0, 4.76 ERA (11.1 IP, 6 ER) in two career starts vs. Baltimore...earned the win in his last start on May 24 at Camden Yards, allowing three runs in 6.1 innings with seven strikeouts...allowed solo home runs to J.J. Hardy (3rd inning), Chris Davis (7th inning) and Jonathan Schoop (7th inning).

**BETTER WITH AGE:** Berríos already has more wins (7) in 10 starts this season than he did in 14 starts last season (3)...at 65 strikeouts on the year, he's already surpassed his season total from last season (49)...has thrown 65.1 innings this season in 10 starts after throwing 58.1 innings in 14 starts last season...overall, was 3-7 with a 8.02 ERA (58.1 IP, 52 ER) in his 14 starts last season and is 7-2, 3.44 ERA (65.1 IP, 25 ER) in 10 starts this season.

**SINCE HIS PROMOTION:** Since his first start of the season on May 7, Berríos ranks second in the American League in WHIP (1.07), third in opponent average (.214), and wins (7) and ninth in ERA (3.44).

**BUILDING MOMENTUM:** Berríos is 8-4, 3.75 ERA (81.2 IP, 34 ER) with 73 strikeouts in his last 14 starts dating back to last season...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of the 14 starts...Minnesota has won eight of his last 14 starts.

**COOL UNDER PRESSURE:** Opponents are hitting .186 (16-for-86) with 31 strikeouts with runners on base this season vs. Berríos, and .214 (9-for-42) with 17 strikeouts with a runner in scoring position.

**STICKING AROUND:** Berríos has thrown 6.0-plus innings in seven of his 10 starts this season...pitched into the seventh inning in three of his last four starts...pitched 6.0-plus innings just once in his 14 starts last season, and 5.0-plus innings just seven times.

**NOT BAD, KID:** Berríos recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts on May 18 vs. Colorado, becoming the youngest pitcher to record 11-plus strikeouts in a game this season, and the youngest Twin to do so since Francisco Liriano on July 28, 2006 vs. Detroit...is the first Twin to record 11-plus strikeouts in a game since Ervin Santana on September 5, 2015 at Houston...is the first Twin to collect 11-plus strikeouts and not allow a run since Liriano on August 1, 2010 vs. Seattle.

**UNDER CONTROL:** Berríos is averaging 2.62 walks per nine innings this season, walking three-plus batters just twice in his 10 starts...averaged 5.40 walks per nine innings last season, issuing three or more walks in seven of his 14 starts.

**A PITCHER'S BEST FRIEND:** Berríos has induced eight groundball double plays this season, tied with Kyle Gibson for the most on the Twins since his promotion on May 7...ranks tied for first in all of baseball with eight double plays since May 28 (also: Kyle Gibson)...induced just five groundball double plays in 14 starts last season.

**FOR THE RED WINGS:** Was 3-0, 1.13 ERA (39.2 IP, 5 ER) with eight walks and 39 strikeouts in six starts for Triple-A Rochester this season...ranked first in the International League in ERA and WHIP (0.81), tied for second in wins, third in innings pitched and fourth in strikeouts...promoted to Minnesota on May 12.

**WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC:** Berríos played for Team Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, going 1-0, 8.10 ERA (6.2 IP, 6 ER) with two walks and 10 strikeouts.
