**TIGERS NOTES:**

- The Tigers have lost four straight games and fell to 0-4 when they score four runs or fewer.
- The Tigers were 2-9 with runners in scoring position in tonight's game.
- Tiger pitchers walked 18 Twins batters in the three-game series.
- Robertson fell to 1-3, 4.91 (36.2 ip, 20 er) in seven games (six starts) in his career vs. the Twins.
- For the three game series, Tiger's starters were a combined 0-2, 9.58 (10.1 ip, 11 er) allowing 17 hits, 7 walks, 3 home runs, and striking out only 3 batters
- Ivan Rodriguez extended his hit streak to six consecutive games, batting .385 (10-26) in that span.

**TWINS NOTES:**

- The Twins have won four straight games, it is their longest win streak since they won nine in a row from 9/7-16/04.
- The Twins have not scored first in any of their nine games this season, Twins opponents have scored in the first inning in eight of the nine games.

- For the series, the Twins had 32 hits and 23 runs scored.
- With the win tonight, Radke tied Jim Perry for third place in career wins (128) on the Twins All-Time list.
- Radke gave up his first walk of the season in the first inning, a span of 13 innings.
- Radke improved to 18-6, 4.48 (199.0 ip, 99 er) in 31 career games vs. the Tigers.
- In the fifth inning, Gardenhire was ejected for the first time this season, and the 16<sup>th</sup> in his career.
- Jones had his third multi-rbi game of the season, the second time he has had two rbi in a game.
- Mike Redmond had his first multi-rbi game since he had three rbi on 5/21/04 vs. Arizona.
- Michael Cuddyer walked a career-high three times in tonight's game.
- The Twins batted .333 (4-12) with runners in scoring position and left 10 runners on base in tonight's game.
